The primary objective of this mechanism is to ensure a conducive and supportive environment for students' holistic academic growth, well-being and equitable justice.

The committee constituted at the college level proactively addresses and resolves a wide spectrum of student concerns, including:

- *Academic Pressure and Stress:* Providing counseling, orientation programs, and individualized support to help students manage the rigors of their curriculum and maintain a healthy work-life balance.
- *Complaints and Misunderstandings:* Investigating and mediating disputes related to fellow students, faculty, or administrative staff in a fair, confidential, and timely manner.
- *Non-Availability of Certain Facilities:* Systematically reviewing complaints regarding infrastructure, laboratory equipment, library resources, or other essential campus facilities, and working with the administration to swiftly implement necessary improvements or provide suitable alternatives.
- *Assignment-Related Queries:* Clarifying expectations for complex assignments, addressing concerns about grading, and ensuring that assessment processes are transparent and equitable.
- *Project Work Stress:* Offering mentorship and guidance for major projects, helping students with resource allocation, time management, and overcoming technical or conceptual hurdles.
- *Examination-Related Issues:* Handling queries and grievances pertaining to examination schedules (midterm and end semester exams), result discrepancies (if any), and the overall fairness of the evaluation process.

Through regular meetings and established communication channels, the committee ensures that every grievance is heard, documented, and acted upon. Students are not only provided with solutions to their immediate problems but are also offered constructive advice and counseling to better navigate future challenges, fostering a culture of trust and ensuring that the student experience remains positive and focused on educational attainment.
